NOTE. In New South Wales and Victoria wages are in a fluctuating state. In the former, skilled labour generally commands from 8s. to 10s.; and unskilled, from 6s. to 7s. per day. Labourers on the public works of the colony are usually paid 1s. a day less than ordinary wages, so as not to interfere with private employers.

WAGES IN THE WEST INDIES.

BRITISH GUIANA.—There is no fixed rate of wages. They are raised or lowered as the estate feels the necessity for labour. 4*d.* an hour is what any ordinary labourer may earn. 6*s.* 8*d.* a week is the minimum rate of wages allowed for an indentured labourer to earn.

The unindentured labourer is employed by the task and in gangs. The wages depend on the nature of the work. Any labourer working steadily every day in the week might earn 1*l.* 5*s.*; but few instances occur where the negro works more than two or three days in the week. This is accounted for by his natural disposition to idleness, coupled with the fact that one day's labour will supply him with one week's wants.—*Report of C. Williams, Esq., Acting Immigration Agent, 10 March 1858.*

TRINIDAD.—The only labourers well adapted for field work in this climate are Africans and their descendants, Chinese, and East Indians.

It may be assumed, as a general rule, that nine hours ordinary work is never paid less than 1*s.* 8*d.* sterling per day, with house rent free, garden, and medical attendance. Skilled labour, if trenching may be so called, 3*s.* and upwards; 1*s.* 0*d.* is the usual daily payment for piece work, which an able hand may finish in four hours. In addition to this, unindentured labourers who choose to renew their contracts receive an annual bonus of from 2*l.* to 4*l.* These rates apply to agricultural labour. Carpenters and masons receive one dollar and upwards, and are few in number, and are indifferent workmen.—*Report from H. Mitchell, Esq., Agent General of Immigration, Feb. 23, 1858.*

JAMAICA.—Rates of wages vary according to the work to be performed. As a general rule, able and industrious labourers may always expect to receive 1*s.* 6*d.* a day for nine hours of steady continuous labour.

LEGAL AND MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS.

The following Table contains the official Replies from the undermentioned Colonies to the Questions whether British and Foreign Barristers, Attorneys, Physicians, Surgeons, and Apothecaries can practise immediately after Arrival in the Colony, on the Strength of their British or Foreign Qualifications, or whether they must undergo any and what Process to obtain Colonial Qualifications, before they can practise:—

CANADA EAST	Barristers cannot practise in Lower (or Eastern) Canada without a previous service under articles during 5 years (or 4 years in case they are graduates of a university). With regard to apothecaries, it is intended to introduce a bill in the Colonial Parliament regulating their education and qualifications. Persons, however, possessing the diploma of the Royal College of Surgeons of England and the Apothecaries Company (otherwise called General Practitioners in England), will be entitled, by a late regulation, to practise all the branches of medicine without any further examination of the Board of Governors, save that of satisfying the Board that they are the persons whose names are mentioned in their diplomas.
CANADA WEST	Barristers, being natives of the United Kingdom or of a British colony, producing their certificates of admission to the bar, can practise at once in this province.	Attorneys, being natives of the United Kingdom or of a British colony, must serve, under articles of clerkship, for 1 year, in the province before they can legally practise. He must enter as a student with a barrister residing and practising in the province, and continue as such student for one year. At the expiration of one year from his admission as an attorney he may be called to the bar, if his conduct in the meantime has been good.		No person can practise physic or surgery, or demand or receive any fee or reward for the cure of diseases, or the performance of any surgical operation, unless he shall have obtained a diploma from some college or other public institution of Great Britain, Ireland, or Canada, authorized to grant the same; or, unless he shall have been carefully examined by competent judges appointed by the Governor of the Province in Council, and upon their report shall have received a license from the Governor for that purpose. Every person thus duly qualified is entitled to demand, sue for, and recover reasonable and customary fees for his services, and payment for medicines by him administered in the course of his practice, either as physician or surgeon. There are no regulations as to apothecaries.
