NOTE	Herbert Leslie Greener, teacher, journalist, archeologist and artist, was born in Cape Town, South Africa on 13/2/1900. He was educated in England and served in India after graduating from the Royal Military College, Sandhurst. He was also prisoner of war in Japan. He was involved in several archaeological expeditions in Egypt, and participated in the removal of monuments in Nubia to make way for the Aswan Dam. His first wife was artist Rhona Haszard. After some time in Sydney he settled in Tasmania in 1949.
DESCRIPTION	Correspondence, including personal and family letters dating from 1908; manuscripts, including a "Mafeking Diary" by Greener's father about the Boer War; archeological papers; papers on Tasmanian history and monuments especially the Ross Bridge; lectures, talks, A.B.C. scripts, autobiographical material, financial papers, notebooks, diaries and photographs. Also a manuscript by George Dibbern entitled <u>Ship without port</u> .
