## Observations

- 1. Louise comes to life through these letters as a vibrant, strong, capable character, full of life and very sociable and hospitable. There is a constant stream of visitors wherever they live.
- 2. In comparison to Louise's letters, George Charles Knight Gregson's letters were frequently complaining about the weather, the workmen and Australian politics. He appears to be a bit of a curmudgeon. Later in life he appears to suffer from depression as does his sister, Mary Gregson.
- 3. Louise is very close to her family/siblings and tries hard to maintain contact with everyone.

- 4. Louise's letters to elder brother George are more formal than the chatty ones she writes to Carrie and Pringle.
- 5. Louise loves her sister Isabella (Issie) but suspects that as Issie's health declines, the 2 daughters control her and her mail. Louise is never sure whether her letters get through to Issie or are destroyed by Amy or Cora.
- 6. As Louise gets older, she finds the heat harder to bear. She also misses the old country and her family more and more
- 7. Later in life, Louise takes great comfort from Ethel's help & company. Ethel works hard around the house while maintaining a bright, happy personality. Carrie appears to be more absent-minded and like her father, George doesn't enjoy the constant stream of visitors.
- 8. Sister Carrie back in England seems to have a life-long partner called Robin Turnbull but he doesn't seem to appear in the family trees I have seen.
