Regards [Redacted]</p>	<p>18/02/2022 7:56 AM</p>	<p>Dear [redacted],</p> <p>Thank you for contacting the Library about the takedown of these issues of the APS Employment Gazette.</p> <p>Your takedown request has been reviewed and a decision has been made under the National Library Regulations 2018 to restrict online access to the material for the security reasons outlined in your request. We acknowledge receipt of the listing of affected issues that are archived in the Australian Web Archive (2015-2019) and look forward to receiving the list for the issues held in National Edeposit Collection (2020 onwards).</p> <p>With regard to your intended provision of the altered versions, we would be happy to receive all issues via the NED Portal as you are doing for current issues of the Gazette. Feel free to contact the NED team on [redacted]@nla.gov.au when you are ready to deposit, if you require any assistance with bulk deposit and sequencing of the altered issues.</p> <p>After considering the resources and work involved, we have determined that we would not add the altered versions for the 2015-2019 issues in sequence into to the Australian Web Archive. However, we are able to provide a reference in the Archive pointing to the NED Collection, and our NED collection is fully searchable via Trove.</p> <p>We have begun the work on restricting the original 2015-2019 issues in the web archive. NLAref188176	<p>Good afternoon, I work at the APSC in APS Jobs. Previously our team sent an enquiry regarding the APS Gazettes that are uploaded and archived on the NLA website. Several of the Gazettes from 2017-2019 have restricted access to the public and our team also no longer has access. We have received a number of queries from the public looking to access the Gazettes however, we are unable to provide access. Is it possible to make these Gazettes accessible to the public or can you providing reasoning as to why the access is restricted? The previous response from NLA provided us with a link with information on restrictions, but we had not been provided any reasoning around why the Gazettes have been restricted. [Redacted]</p>	29/07/2024 3:43 PM	<p>Dear [redacted]</p> <p>Thank you for contacting the National Library of Australia regarding 2015-2017 issues of the APS Employment Gazette. Thank you also for talking to me today by phone.</p> <p>As discussed, it seems that a technical glitch in our Web Archive (AWA) was causing many of the gazettes not to display properly. This has been fixed and I have checked a few and they seem to be displaying properly now. Please let me know if you still have issues.</p> <p>As I mentioned, some of them will still be suppressed, as per the request we received from your colleague [redacted] in 2022 to suppress certain issues. Just to refresh you on that [redacted] asked for selected Gazettes from 2015 to 2019 to be removed from our Web archive, and also selected issues from 2020 and 2021 from our NED portal (our National edeposit service). The reason given at the time was that "A working Group of various Commonwealth agencies (including Security agencies) has identified that there is information contained within issues of the Public Service Gazette that needs to be redacted due to security concerns". [Redacted] later clarified that the Australian Government Service Number (AGSN) for employees in certain notices were the concern. As you know, your team were then going to supply redacted copies to replace them. We asked for all issues (including the 2015-2019 issues) to be submitted via our NED portal, rather than through the Web Archive. This is because we cannot retrospectively add content to existing archived pages in the web archive. However, while the redacted issues for 2020-2021 were submitted to NED, it does not appear that we ever received the redacted issues for 2015-2019.</p> <p>Our last correspondence with [redacted] regarded the submission of the redacted copies, as well as a copy of the spreadsheet [redacted] sent to us with the issues from 2015-2019 that were to be suppressed in the AWA (and therefore still require redacted versions to be submitted to NED). In order to progress the uploading of these issues to NED, I suggest you get back in contact with [redacted] in the NED team. Rather than using her personal email though, I recommend that you email [redacted]@nla.gov.au, to ensure your email is not missed if [redacted] happens to be away. I have briefed her manager, [redacted], and she knows the history of the situation, so she will also keep an eye out for your email.</p> <p>As I mentioned, I am doing a final check with our Web archiving team to make sure that only the requested issues remain suppressed in AWA. We had only archived them on the NLA website so we don't currently have any other way to access them. Your assistance would be greatly appreciated.
